
Are Softball and Baseball-the Same?

It might look like baseball, and it might sound like baseball, but softball is not baseball. Just like netball and basketball are different, softball and baseball are different sports. How can that be? After all, the two sports use the same equipment: a bat, a ball, three bases and gloves. However, things are done differently in the two games.

A softball game has seven innings, while a baseball game has nine. The softball field is smaller than a baseball field. A softball is bigger and softer than a baseball. In softball, pitchers throw the ball underarm. In baseball, they throw it overarm. In baseball, pitchers also pitch off a raised area called a mound.

In both sports, players can hit or bunt the ball, and steal bases. The fielding positions are the same too.

In baseball, the bases are further apart than in softball. In softball, you can only steal a base after the ball has left the pitcher's hand. In baseball, you can steal a base at anytime the ball is in play.
